


Where Year-round E15 Is Allowed

More than 22 states and Washington, D.C. allow year-round sales of E15 gasoline (15% ethanol) and have done so for many years. States enable year-round E15 sales either by opting out of the E10 Reid Vapor Pressure (RVP) waiver or by participating in the Reformulated Gasoline (RFG) program.




Legal to Sell. Rarely Sold.

Even in states where E15 is allowed year-round, **consumer demand remains negligible**. Across the West, Midwest, South, and Northeast, only **a tiny fraction of gas stations offer E15** — demonstrating that demand simply isn't there.



Even in the Corn Belt, E15 Remains a Niche Fuel

Midwestern states, home to the nation's top corn producers, have been the strongest advocates for year-round E15. Ethanol blends directly benefit farm economies. Yet **even in these leading states, E15 adoption remains limited** and grows only through incremental station additions.



Why Invest Without Demand?

Multiple analyses show that adding E15 can cost retailers anywhere from a few thousand dollars for limited retrofits to tens — or even hundreds — of thousands of dollars per station when new tanks, dispensers, or piping are required.

The Petroleum Marketers Association of America (PMAA) estimates the average **cost to retrofit a station for E15 compliance at \$375,000–\$425,000 per site**.

Even in the many states where year-round E15 is legal, only a small fraction of stations offer it. With high infrastructure costs and little consumer demand, the market has made its position clear.
